

The Spring 2013 Semester signaled the Accounting Department's annual drive to involve students and faculty in the Voluntary Income Tax Assistance program (VITA). VITA offers free tax help to families of modest income who need assistance in preparing their own tax returns. IRS-certified student volunteers provide free basic income tax return preparation to qualified individuals in local communities. The Accounting Department partners with Catholic Charities of Fort Worth to recruit student-volunteers for the VITA program.

This year, the UTA VITA program held a rally on January 18th to encourage students to participate. Speakers included Mary Goosens, VP of Administration of Catholic Charities; Diane Patrick, Texas House of Representatives, District 94; Kathy Kelly, Executive Director, Fort Worth Chapter, Texas Society of CPAs; and Tania Sederthal, UTA Beta Alpha Psi President. The speakers extolled the virtues of public service and thanked the students for their desire to volunteer and give back to the community.

On January 19th, thirty student-volunteers participated in a six-hour training program to get them certified by the IRS to prepare individual tax returns for the VITA program. The training session was led by UTA Senior Lecturer John Repsis. At this time, the volunteers also signed-up for participation times at various locations in the Arlington and Fort Worth areas.
