Welcome to the Summer 2013 edition of the UTA *Department of Accounting* newsletter. It has been six months since Dr. Rachel Croson arrived as Dean for the College of Business. She has been working on a strategic plan for the college and has already instituted some changes within the college. A big change that affects the Department of Accounting is the move of the Business Law faculty and courses into the Department in fall 2013. As part of this move, we have spent much time reviewing our offerings in this field. For many years all business majors have been required to take BLAW 3311, LAW I, which was primarily based on teaching the US uniform commercial code. Starting in 2014, we will be changing the required undergraduate class for business students to BLAW 3310, Legal and Ethical Environment of Business. This course is expected to provide a much broader view of the legal environment we face today. BLAW I and II will continue to be taught as electives. We are also adding an additional law course in the graduate program for accounting majors.

On April 27th 2013, we had our annual spring banquet and awards program. We were honored to have Dean Croson as the keynote speaker. Dr. Croson provided some of her vision on the future of business dealing with technology issues, privacy issues, and how to make what we teach in business schools relevant because it will affect everyone's quality of life. Through the generosity of our donors, more than 40 highly qualified and deserving students received scholarships, which was an increase of more than 50% compared to last year.

Spring 2013 commencement was a truly wonderful event for accounting students, families and friends. We had 60 students graduating with a BBA or BS degree and 26 students graduating with a Masters degree. As a highlight, we were joined by Mr. Jim Spaniolo, who was attending his last commencement as President of UTA. His impact on UTA has been significant and will be felt for many years to come. The keynote speaker was Mr. Robert Earley, the CEO of JPS Health Network. He advised students to be happy, humble and to treat others with respect.

During the COB 2013 spring meeting several accounting faculty were recognized for teaching and research. Drs. Jap Efendi and Terry Skantz were recipients of the summer faculty fellowships for their publications in The Accounting Review. Dr. Skantz was also the recipient of the Distinguished Research Publication and honored with the Outstanding Graduate Teaching Award. *(continued on Page 2)*

I am also proud to announce that our accounting alumni, Mr. Chuck Lambert and Ms. Jeanne Smith, won two of the three College of Business Alumni awards this year during the 2013 Business Alumni and Service Awards ceremony on March 2, 2013. More information is provided on page 5.

I am also excited to report that one of our adjunct faculty was the recipient of a national award by the Association of Certified Fraud Examiners. The ACFE is the world's largest anti-fraud organization with more than 66,000 members from 160 countries. Mr. Jeff Matthews, who has taught a fraud examination course at UTA the last two semesters, received the 'Certified Fraud Examiner of the Year Award' on June 23, 2013 during the annual meeting of the ACFE in Las Vegas. All these awards highlight both the exception-al quality of research and teaching at UTA and in the Department of Accounting, in particular.

We also conducted a faculty search in the spring semester and have hired a highly regarded faculty to start in fall 2013. Dr. Ramgopal Venkataraman joins us as an untenured Associate Professor. He graduated from Penn State University in 2001 and spent several years at the University of Minnesota and SMU. He is a Fellow of the Chartered Accountants in India and the Institute of the Cost and Works Accountants. He has publications in leading accounting journals as well as experience in both public accounting and industry. He rose from a staff accountant to partner in public accounting and then serving as a Finance Manager and Project Manager in two different companies in India and the Middle East.

I am also proud to announce the 3nd Annual Free CPE Day for alumni. The event is set for August 14th, 2013 at the University Center. Please set your day aside for this event.
